

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 6 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1936, and with reference to Notification dated the 20th day of October, 1936, and published under No. 1006 in the *Gazette* of the 23rd October, 1936, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to sanction and hereby sanctions the acquisition, under the provisions of the said Laws, of the immovable properties situated in the village of Moniatis, in the District of Limassol, and registered in the books of the Land Registry Office in the names of Nicodimos Mylonas, Bishop, and Makarios I. Maherotis, Archimandrite, for and on behalf of the Monastery of Mesopotamos, under registration numbers appearing in the Schedule hereto, the particulars whereof are specifically set out in the said Schedule.
