ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1729

MADE UNDER SECTION 52 (a).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 (a) of the Customs Law, 1936, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Linen Thread) Exemption Order, 1937.
- 2. From and after the date hereof, linen thread imported into the Colony and proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller to be of British Empire origin shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.
