THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW, 1879.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 4.

H. R. PALMER,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Prison Discipline Law, 1879, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make and hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Prison (Amendment) Regulations, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Prison Regulations, 1908 to 1936, (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations"), and the Principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Prison Regulations, 1908 to 1937.

2. Regulation 129 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"Prison food.

129. Prisoners before trial who do not provide themselves with food shall receive the quantity of food specified in dietary No. 3 prescribed in Schedule C. hereto."

3. Regulation 141 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
"Ration scales.

141. Subject to the provisions of Regulation 43, every

141. Subject to the provisions of Regulation 43, every convicted prisoner shall receive the quantity of food specified in the scale of dietary, prescribed in Schedule C. hereto."

4. Regulation 192 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—
"Diet scale. 192. The scale of dietary as laid down in Schedule C. hereto shall be strictly adhered to."

Weekly dietary for male prisoners actually performing hard manual labour such as stone breaking, road making and other public works, shoemaking, etc.:—

The dietary shall be the same as dietary No. 1 with the addition of 50 drams of bread to the midday meals for each prisoner.

DIETARY No. 3.

Dietary for male and female prisoners under sentence of imprisonment not exceeding 14 days :—

- (a) Breakfasts: The same as in dietary No. 1.
- (b) Midday Meals:—

Daily, 250 drams of bread.

DIETARY No. 4.

Punishment diet for all prisoners:—

No punishment diet shall be inflicted for more than ten consecutive days and there shall be an interval of not less than seven days of ordinary diet between each period of such diet.

No prisoner on punishment diet shall be employed on hard manual labour during the period he may be on punishment diet: Provided always that he shall be required to clean his own cell.

PART II.

- 1. The vegetables supplied in dietaries Nos. 1, 2 and 3 of Part I of this Schedule shall be fresh and of a cheap wholesome description, such as potatoes, kolokas, vegetable marrows, cabbages, onions; the meat shall be 75 drams cooked and free of bones; the meat, rice and bones shall be stewed and served as a stew or soup, sufficient salt being added.
- 2. Fresh fruit of cheap and wholesome description may, upon the order of the Medical Officer of the Prison and in such quantities as he may direct, be supplied as an extra, to prisoners on dietary Nos. 1, 2 and 3 of Part I of this Schedule.
- 3. In this Schedule one dram equals 1/400th part of an oke and an oke equals $2.8\,$ lbs."
