# ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 1735

## MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

### H. R. PALMER,

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 52 of the Customs Law, 1936, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Articles for the Celebration of the Coronation) Exemption Order, 1937.

2. From and after the date hereof, the following articles, that is to say-

(a) fireworks, and

(b) red, white and blue bunting, and

(c) red and blue electric light globes,

imported into the Colony and---

(i) proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller to be of British Empire origin, and

(ii) certified by a Commissioner to be imported for use for or in connection with the celebration of the Coronation of His Majesty,

shall be admitted into the Colony free from all import duties.

THE TREE PLANTING VILLAGE AREAS LAWS, 1930 TO 1936.
