

And whereas the Governor considers it expedient that the area described in the said report should be limited :

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 13 of the Tree Planting Village Areas Laws, 1930 to 1936, has been pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

The area described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be and shall be reserved as the Tree Planting Area of the village of Lophos in the District of Limassol.

SCHEDULE.

The area lying within the following boundaries, that is to say:—

The boundary begins at the north-western corner of plot No. 563, plan No. XLVII/51, locality "Plakati," on a track, and goes eastwards and south-eastwards, passing along the boundaries of, and including in the reserved area, plot No. 563 of the same plan, plots Nos. 227, 226, 225, 304, 305, 306, 346, 347, 348, 350, 351, 353, 354, 362, 363, 369, 370, 457, plan No. XLVII/52, locality "Piyi," to the most northern point of plot No. 457, on the road from the village of Lophos to Limassol; thence south-eastwards, along the western side of this road, to the most northern point of plot No. 335, plan No. XLVII/60; thence westwards and southwards, passing along the boundaries of, and including in the reserved area, plots Nos. 397, 391, 392, 394, 395, 387, 388, 356, 297, 300, 299, 298, 295, 303, 305, 302, 306, 494.3, 226, 93, 94, 211, 212, 208, 100, 101, 107, 106, 157, 108, 109, 206, 196, 195, 194, 193, 192, 189, 161, 186, 182, 181, 168, 180, 69, 170, 172, plan No. XLVII/60, to the most southern point of plot No. 172, on a track and on the boundary of the village of Lophos; thence north-westwards, along this village boundary, which is the track, to the most eastern point of plot No. 158 of the same plan, locality "Kaparetti"; thence north-westwards along the aforesaid track to the starting point.

The area reserved comprises 1,657 donums approximately, as shown edged in red on the plan filed in D.L.R.S. M.P. 702/35.

No. 52. THE CUSTOMS LAW, 1936.

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL
UNDER SECTION 70.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 70 of the Customs Law, 1936, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, is pleased to make and hereby makes the following regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs Warehouses Regulations, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Notification of the Governor dated the 29th day of May, 1933, and published under No. 437 in the *Gazette* of the second day of June, 1933, as amended by the

Notification of the Governor dated the 26th day of March, 1934, and published under No. 395 in the *Gazette* of the 6th day of April, 1934, (hereinafter called "the Principal Regulations"), and the Principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Customs Warehouses Regulations, 1933 to 1937.

2. Paragraph 5 of Part I of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following further proviso :

"Provided further that where any delay has occurred in clearing goods from any Customs store and it is shown to the satisfaction of the Comptroller that such delay is due to circumstances beyond the control of the importer, the Comptroller may at his discretion, in special cases, and when not less than two days store rent is due on such goods, allow a reduction of store rent up to seventy-five per cent. of the rent due at the time such goods are cleared from the Customs store."

3. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 31st day of December, 1936.
