No. 68. THE BANK HOLIDAYS LAW, 1928.

PROCLAMATION MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Bank Holidays Law, 1928, and with the advice of the Executive Council, I, Herbert Richmond Palmer, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, do hereby proclaim as follows :—

The twelfth day of May of the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven is hereby appointed to be and shall be observed as a bank holiday for the purposes of the Bank Holidays Law, 1928.

THE ELEMENTARY EDUCATION LAWS, 1933 TO 1936.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 5.

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 5 of the Elementary Education Laws, 1933 to 1936, His Excellency the Governor is pleased to make and hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Elementary Education (Coronation Holiday) Regulations, 1937.

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other regulations contained, the twelfth day of May of the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven shall be a school holiday and shall be observed as such in all schools and by all teachers.
