THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 45.

Inner Harbour Famagusta.

WINSTER,

Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by Defence Regulation 45, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, do hereby order that, from and after the 1st day of May, 1947, no vessel shall enter, leave, shift berth or move in the Inner Harbour of Famagusta between the local meantimes of sunset and sunrise, except with the prior permission in writing of the Superintendent of the Port of Famagusta, subject to such conditions as to him may seem fit to impose :

Provided that nothing in this Order shall apply to—

- (a) vessels flying the White Ensign or a foreign naval flag ; or
- (b) small craft plying between vessels at anchor in the Inner Harbour and the landing steps of the jetty, or between vessels at anchor outside the Inner Harbour and the northern end of the quay in the Inner Harbour, provided such small craft shall, while under way, carry where it can best be seen an all-round white light.

2. Any person who contravenes this Order or fails to observe or comply with any condition contained in any permit of the Superintendent of the Port of Famagusta is liable to the penalties prescribed in Defence Regulation 94, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946.

3. Any officer of police and any person holding a commission in any of His Majesty's Forces may, as an authorized officer, in relation to any vessel, take such steps and use such force as may appear to such officer to be reasonably necessary for securing compliance with this Order relating to the vessel or for enabling proceedings to be effectually taken in respect of any offence committed in connection therewith.

THE LAND ACQUISITION LAWS, 1899 TO 1947.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

Governor.

Whereas it has been represented to me by the Military Authorities that it is desirable in the interests of His Majesty's Forces to establish a Leave Camp for service personnel in the district of Famagusta the cost whereof is to be borne by His Majesty's Military Authorities.

Now, therefore, I, Reginald Thomas Herbert, Baron Winster of Witherslack, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1947, do hereby declare the establishment of a Leave Camp as aforesaid to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust to Major J. H. Wallace, Deputy Assistant Director, Hirings and Disposals (Fixed Assets), the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.
