

No. 139. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1946.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

It is hereby notified that by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 66 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1946, and duly deputed to me, I hereby approve the premises described in the third column of the Schedule hereto, belonging to the person whose name is set out in the first column of that Schedule and occupied by the firm whose name is set out in the second column of that Schedule, to be a private warehouse for the warehousing and securing of the goods specified in the fourth column of the said Schedule without payment of import duties upon the first entry of such goods therein.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1945.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF FAMAGUSTA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1945, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Famagusta hereby make the following bye-laws:—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Famagusta Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Famagusta Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to (No. 2) 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Famagusta Municipal Bye-laws, 1940 to 1947.

2. Bye-law 7 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—

"7.—The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the person in charge of any animal or pig sold within the animal market:—

(a) For every ass, camel, horse, mule or ox	s.	p.

Provided that no fee shall be paid for the young ones of such animals up to 12 months old if running loose with their mothers, when sold within the animal market.

(b) For every goat or sheep	1	0
(c) For every kid or lamb under three months	-	4
(d) For every pig of any age	1	0

3. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 12 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“ (1) The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the owner or the person in charge of the following goods brought into or on sale in the Municipal Market No. 1 and the Municipal Market No. 2:—

- (a) Goods other than meat or pork and other than the goods referred to in paragraphs (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) hereof— *p.*
- (i) When the value of such goods does not exceed two shillings 1
 - (ii) When the value of such goods exceeds two shillings but does not exceed five shillings .. 2
 - (iii) When the value of such goods exceeds five shillings but does not exceed ten shillings .. 3
 - (iv) When the value of such goods exceeds ten shillings but does not exceed one pound .. 4

If the value of such goods exceeds one pound, a fee of 1*p.* for each additional five shillings or fraction thereof shall be added to the afore-mentioned fee of 4*p.*

(b) Cereals—

- (i) When the quantity of a load of barley or oats does not exceed five kiles, a fee of 1*p.*
For every additional kile, 4 paras.
- (ii) When the quantity of a load of wheat or vetches does not exceed five kiles, a fee of 2*p.*
For every additional kile, 4 paras.

(c) Potatoes—

For every oke, a fee of two paras.

(d) Oil—

For every oke a fee of 1*p.*

(e) Fresh fish—

- (i) When the value of such fish does not exceed four shillings per oke, for every oke or part thereof, a fee of $\frac{1}{2}$ *p.*
- (ii) When the value of such fish exceeds four shillings per oke, for every oke or part thereof, a fee of 1*p.*

(f) Game—

- (i) For every hare or brace of partridges or of any other game or wild bird of similar size or for every single partridge or other game or wild bird of similar size, a fee of 4*p.*
- (ii) For becaficoes or other birds of similar size, for every dozen or part thereof, a fee of 2*p.*”

4. Bye-laws 18 and 39 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby repealed.

5. Paragraph (i) of bye-law 48 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“ (i) From two to forty shillings, according to the size and position of the booth, to be determined in each case by the inspector.”

6. Paragraphs (2) and (3) of bye-law 49 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby repealed and the following paragraphs substituted therefor:—

7. Bye-law 133 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 133.—(1) The following fees shall be paid to the inspector by the owner or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house :—

(a) For every ox, camel or pig of any age, for every oke or part thereof	—	2
(b) For every goat or sheep	3	0
(c) For every unweaned kid or lamb slaughtered between the 1st of December and 31st of March	2	0
(d) For every kid or lamb slaughtered between the 1st of April and 30th of November	3	0

(2) In this bye-law “ weight ” means the weight of the carcass after it is skinned, cleaned and dressed, excluding the head and legs.”

8. Paragraph (a) of bye-law 198 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

“(a) for theatres having an entrance fee, not more than £36 yearly.”

9. Bye-law 246 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figure “ £150 ” (line 2) and the substitution therefor of the figure “ £600 ”.

10. Bye-law 253 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

“ 253. There shall be paid to the treasurer in every year by any person keeping any of the following places or buildings within the municipal limits the fee determined by the Council set out against each such place or building, that is to say—

The fee shall be in respect of the period ending on the 31st December of each year irrespective of the time when it becomes chargeable.”

11. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the Second Schedule and the substitution therefor of the following Schedule :—

**THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF FUEL AND CHARCOAL)
ORDER, 1944.**

NOTICE UNDER CLAUSE 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me under clause 6 of the Defence (Control of Fuel and Charcoal) Order, 1944, I hereby revoke, with effect from to-day, Notification No. 17 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 20th January, 1944, whereby the following were declared Fuelwood Controlled areas :—

The town of Nicosia and the villages of Kaimakli, Trakhonas, Omorphita, Palouriotissa, Eylenja (Aglanja), Engomi, Ayios Dhometios, Orta Keuy (Minzeli) and Strovolos in the Nicosia District.
