No. 142. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO 1946.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2241
MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1946, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Fire Bricks) Exemption Order, 1947.
2. From and after the publication of this Order in the *Gazette* all fire bricks imported into the Colony by any person who satisfies the Comptroller of Customs that they are imported for industrial purposes and are of British Empire origin shall be admitted free from all import duties.

No. 143. THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY LAWS, 1939 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTIONS 3 (2) AND 12B.

WINSTER,
Governor.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 3 (2) and 12B of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945, (hereinafter referred to as "the Law"), do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Enemy Territory Cessation) (Dodecanese Islands) Order, 1947.
2. The Dodecanese Islands shall for all purposes of the Law and for the purposes of any order made thereunder cease to be treated as if they were enemy territory.
3. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 3 of the Law, any person, unless I otherwise direct, may trade within the Dodecanese Islands with any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business therein.
4. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 14th March, 1947.
