

3. Paragraph (5) of rule 92 of the principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words and figure "ten per centum (10%)" and the substitution therefor of the words and figure "fifteen per centum (15%)".

4. The principal Rules are hereby amended by the insertion therein, immediately after Rule 101, of the following heading and rule:—

**"DISPOSAL OF PRODUCE THROUGH A REGISTERED SOCIETY.**

101A.—(1) In a registered society which has as one of its objects the disposal of any article produced or obtained by the work or industry of its members, every member who undertakes to deliver produce shall do so as may be prescribed in the bye-laws or in the relevant contract to be disposed of by the society.

(2) Any member who, upon reference to the Registrar for decision under section 52 of the Law, is found to have acted in contravention of the bye-laws or the relevant contract, as the case may be, shall pay to the society as liquidated damages such sum as may be specifically assessed or ascertained in manner prescribed by the bye-laws or by the relevant contract and such sum shall be deemed to be a debt due to the society."

#### No. 157. The Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 and 1944.

In pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 and 1944, the following rules made by the Committee of the Irrigation Division of Milikouri, in the District of Nicosia, are published in the *Gazette*. (M.P. 442/47.)

#### IRRIGATION DIVISION OF MILIKOURI.

##### Rules.

1. These rules may be cited as the Irrigation Division of Milikouri Rules, 1947.
2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
  - “Commissioner” means the Commissioner of the District of Nicosia;
  - “Committee” means the Committee of the Irrigation Division;
  - “Irrigation Division” means the Irrigation Division of Milikouri;
  - “Law” means the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Laws, 1938 and 1944;
  - “list” means the list of the names and residence of the proprietors and of the lands and extent thereof which are to be benefited or are capable of being benefited by the works prepared under the provisions of section 15 of the Law as finally settled under the provisions of section 16 of the Law;
  - “works” means the irrigation works of the Irrigation Division.
3. The Committee shall hold office for a period of three years beginning on the 12th January, 1947. Thereafter the election of the Committee shall take place every third year in the month of December and it shall hold office for a period of three years from the 12th January next following its election.
