THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1943.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2247

MADE UNDER SECTION 9A.

Authority to the Village Health Commission of Vasa (Kilani) to contract a loan.

WINSTER,

Governor.

I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 9A of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1943, do hereby order as follows:—

The Village Health Commission of Vasa (Kilani) (hereinafter referred to as "the Village Health Commission") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the lenders") the sum of seven hundred and sixty pounds (£760) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Village Health Commission to the lenders in ten equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);
- (b) the Village Health Commission shall, in each year and until the final repayment of the amount borrowed, insert in the annual estimates as a charge on the revenue the annual instalment payable in the year to which such estimates relate;
- (c) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Village Health Commission for the provision in the village of Vasa (Kilani) of a slaughter-house and a market for meat and perishable goods.

THE INTERPRETATION LAW, 1935.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY UNDER SECTION 22.

I, the Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 22 of the Interpretation Law, 1935, do hereby depute the person for the time being holding the office designated in the third column of the Schedule hereto to exercise and perform on my behalf the powers and duties mentioned in the second column of the said Schedule which I am empowered to exercise or perform under the provisions of the Laws set out in the first column of the said Schedule.

2. All previous delegations made under the aforesaid Law are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done thereunder.
