- 5. An adequate supply of life-saving appliances, to be determined by the Comptroller, for the rescue from drowning of persons employed on the pier, shall be maintained.
- 6. A sufficient number of first-aid boxes or cupboards of a standard to be approved by the Comptroller shall be provided on a pier. All first-aid boxes or cupboards shall be marked plainly with a white cross on a red ground.
- 7. Whenever a pier is used for loading or unloading explosives or petroleum products, adequate fire fighting appliances, to the satisfaction of the Comptroller, shall be provided.
- 8. An annual fee not exceeding £50 to be specified in the licence shall be paid by the owner in respect of a licence granted under this Law.
- 9. The Comptroller may exempt a pier from any of the requirements in sections 2, 5 and 6 of these Regulations.
