It is hereby notified for general information that in virtue of the authority vested in him by regulation 6 of the Forest Regulations, 1940 to 1944, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to declare that the Minor State Forests, the areas of which are set out in the Schedule to the Minor State Forests (Nicosia, Kyrenia and Paphos) Orders, 1942 to (No. 2) 1947, as may be amended at any time, shall be reserved as Village Fuel Areas, with the exception of any such areas which are situated within the lands of villages having a municipal corporation which shall be reserved as Municipal Fuel Areas.

2 The notice published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 27th June, 1946, under Notification No. 221, is hereby cancelled without prejudice to anything done thereunder.

No. 321. THE FOREST REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1944.

ORDER MADE UNDER REGULATIONS 8(1) AND 8A.

WINSTER,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by regulations 8(1) and 8a of the Forest Regulations, 1940 to 1944, I, the Governor, do hereby direct that—

- (a) the Village Fuel Areas and Municipal Fuel Areas reserved under Notification No. 320 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 23rd October, 1947; and
- (b) the Funds established or to be established in respect of the said Village Fuel Areas, and Municipal Fuel Areas, respectively, in accordance with the provisions of regulation 12 of the Forest Regulations, 1940 to 1944,

shall be under the control of the Village Commission or the Council of the Municipal Corporation, as the case may be, of the village within the lands of which every such area is situate, respectively.

2. The Order published in Supplement No. 3 to the Gazette of the 27th June, 1946, under Notification No. 222, is hereby repealed without prejudice to anything done thereunder.
