THE CUSTOMS LAW, 1936 TO 1946.

ORDER IN COUNCIL NO. 2268

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to 1946, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Importation (Foodstuffs from Egypt) Prohibition Order, 1947.

2. The importation into the Colony by post of any foodstuffs from Egypt is hereby prohibited.

THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN REGULATION) LAWS, 1922 AND 1933.

PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

R. E. TURNBULL,

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Laws;

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they desire and purpose *ex animo* to work in friendly cooperation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted; and, in particular, they have undertaken that if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils and to make them good citizens of the British Empire;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 8 of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby grant to the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto a permit respectively to commence or carry on the work set down after their respective names.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 4.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to establish a permanent Battalion Camp at Dhekelia, in the District of Larnaca, the cost whereof is to be borne by His Majesty's Military Authorities.

Now, therefore, I, Roland Evelyn Turnbull, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Cyprus, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1947, do hereby declare the establishment of a permanent Battalion Camp as aforesaid to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to Major Jack Hunter Wallace, Deputy Assistant Director of Hirings and Disposals (Fixed Assets), H.Q. Cyprus District.

Cyprus District.
