THE GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES PROVIDENT FUND LAWS, 1945 AND 1947.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 20.

R. E. TURNBULL,

Acting 'Governor.

- I, the Acting Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 20 of the Government Employees Provident Fund Laws, 1945 and 1947, do hereby make the following regulations:—
- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Government Employees Provident Fund Regulations, 1947.
- 2. The age of retirement for the purposes of paragraph (d) of section 15 of the Government Employees Provident Fund Laws, 1945 and 1947, shall, as regards any non-pensionable employee who is appointed to the service of the Government on and after the 1st day of March, 1947, be fifty-five years:

Provided that the Governor may require any such employee to retire from the service at any time after he attains the age of fifty years, in which case the prescribed age shall be the age at which such officer has been required to retire from service.

3. The provisions of these regulations shall also apply to any person who, on the 1st day of July, 1945, held the office of Mail Officer (previously known as Mail Officer, 1st Grade) and who elects to become a depositor prior to the 31st day of May, 1947.
