THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of Defence Regulation 61 as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Imported Articles) (Amendment No. 3) Order, 1947, and shall be read as Gazettes: one with the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Imported Articles) Orders, 1943 to (No. 2) 1947, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Imported Articles) Orders, 1943 to (No. 3) 1947.

Supplement No. 3: 9. 9.1943 4.11.1943 2, 1,1947 16. 1.1947

2. Clause 10 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof of the following proviso:-

"Provided that an importer and reseller shall enter or cause to be entered, daily, in his 'Sales Record Book' the particulars set forth in Part 5 of the said schedule only in respect of his sales to a reseller."

3. Clause 12 of the principal Order is hereby deleted and the following clause substituted therefor:

"12.—(1) Every reseller shall keep in his business premises—

(a) a 'Purchase Record Book' in the form set forth in Part 7 of the First Schedule hereto the pages of which shall be bound together and numbered consecutively, wherein he shall enter or cause to be entered, daily, the particulars set forth in Part 7

of the said schedule;
(b) a 'Sales Record Book' in the form set forth in Part 8 of the First Schedule hereto the pages of which shall be bound together and numbered consecutively, wherein he shall enter or cause to be entered, daily, the particulars set forth in Part 8of the said schedule, in respect of his sales to another reseller.

- (2) Without prejudice to the provisions of sub-clause (1) of this clause, every reseller selling imported articles (other than clothing or textiles which come under the Defence (Sale of Government Clothing and other Textiles) Order, 1946) sold or issued to him by or on behalf of the Government, subject to conditions or otherwise, for distribution or sale to the public by rationing, by the issue of a ticket or coupon or in any other manner whatsoever shall keep in his business premises-
  - (a) a separate 'Sales Record Book' in the form set forth in Part 8 of the First Schedule hereto the pages of which shall be bound together and numbered consecutively, wherein he shall enter or cause to be entered, daily, the particulars set forth in Part 8 of the said schedule in respect of his distribution or sale of such articles to the public;

- (b) such other books or records wherein he shall enter or cause to be entered such matters relating to such distribution or sale and at such time or times as I may from time to time direct."
- 4. Clause 18 of the principal Order is hereby deleted and the following clause substituted therefor:—
  - "18.—(1) Every person exposing for sale any imported article shall display on each and every such article a label on which it shall be written and shown in large and clearly legible characters printed or written in ink—
    - (a) the words 'Sale Price' and immediately after those words the selling price of such article;
    - (b) the word 'Page' and immediately after that word the number of the page of the 'Purchase Record Book' in which the purchase of such article has been entered:

Provided that when an article forms one of a group of articles of the same kind, quality and price all stored at one and the same place in the premises it shall be sufficient if one such label is displayed in a conspicuous place on such group.

- (2) Notwithstanding anything in this Order contained but without prejudice to the operation of clause 13 of this Order, no person shall sell any imported article in excess of the maximum price shown on the label displayed thereon.
- (3) The maximum price shown on any label at which each such article is offered for sale shall not exceed the maximum price at which such article may be sold under the provisions of this Order."
- 5. Paragraph (a) of clause 27 of the principal Order is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—
  - "(a) the person who sells any such article shall, if so required by the purchaser, supply such purchaser with a receipt showing separately the price charged in respect of such article apart from any making up, modification, alteration or repair".
- 6. Part 6 of the First Schedule to this Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of item 6 and the substitution therefor of the following item:—
  - "6. Price charged in respect of article sold and price at which it may be sold by the purchaser to a reseller or the public . . ."
