

(7.) A copy of the prohibition order and of the search warrant shall be left in a conspicuous position at every building or place so entered.

(8.) The owner of any prohibited publication delivered or seized under this Law may at any time within fourteen days after the delivery or seizure apply to the Court for the discharge of the prohibition order, and the Court, if on the hearing of the application it decides that the prohibition order ought not to have been made, shall discharge the order and shall order the prohibited publication delivered by or seized from the applicant to be returned to him.

(9.) Every prohibited publication delivered or seized under this section with respect to which an application is not filed within the time aforesaid or which is not ordered to be returned to the owner shall be taken as forfeited and shall be dealt with in such manner as the High Commissioner may direct.

(10.) For the purposes of this section the Court means the Supreme Court or a Judge thereof.

6. Unless otherwise provided every person guilty of an offence against this Law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

7. A person shall not be prosecuted under this Law without the written consent of the King's Advocate.

8. Nothing in this Law shall be deemed to repeal or affect the provisions of any other law, but so that a person shall not be punished twice for the same offence.

## SEED CORN LOANS.

6 OF 1898.

TO FACILITATE THE LENDING OF SEED CORN FOR AGRICULTURAL PURPOSES.

W. F. HAYNES SMITH.]

[June 4, 1898.]

1. This Law may be cited as the Seed Corn Loans Law, 1898. Short title.

2. In this Law,—

“Seed Corn” means and includes wheat, barley, oats, and vetches; Definitions.

“Tithepayer” means the person by whom tithe in kind is payable;

“Cultivator” means a person to whom seed corn has been lent for the purpose of sowing it.

4. Whenever any seed corn has been advanced by the Receiver General to any cultivator under an agreement to repay it in kind, there shall, immediately upon the threshing of any cereal crop grown by the cultivator of the same kind as the seed corn so advanced, be detached and set apart ~~in addition to any portion of the crop required to be set apart under section 1 of the Tithe Law, 1881,~~ a quantity of the grain equivalent to the amount of seed corn so advanced, together with an addition of ~~one-fourth~~ *one tenth* of the quantity so advanced by way of interest.

5. It shall be the duty of the cultivator, after the grain has been detached and set apart in accordance with the provisions of the last preceding section, in due course to deliver it at the proper Government store, at his own expense, where it shall be measured or weighed by the Storekeeper.

6. Grain which has been set apart under the provisions of this Law for the repayment of seed corn advanced and interest as hereinbefore provided shall not be liable to seizure or sale under any writ for seizure and sale in a civil action, nor shall any order of sequestration or other process to recover debt operate to prevent the cultivator carrying out the requirements of sections 4 and 5.

7. Any cultivator who, in breach of the conditions required to be performed by him under sections 4 and 5, fails before the ensuing 1st of October to deliver at the proper Government Store at his own expense, any grain due from him, shall, in addition to his liability to make good the value thereof, be further liable to pay an additional sum of five per cent. on the gross value of the grain; and if he similarly fails to deliver before the 1st of November, an addition of another five per cent. upon the value of the grain.
