

conviction and of any disqualification to which the convicted person has become subject shall be endorsed on any licence held by the offender.

(2) A person who by virtue of an order of the Court under sub-section (1) is disqualified from holding or obtaining a licence may appeal against the order in the same manner as against a conviction and the Court may, if it thinks fit, pending the appeal, suspend the operation of the order.

(3) Where a person who is disqualified by virtue of a conviction or order under this section is the holder of a licence, the licence shall be suspended so long as the disqualification continues in force and the licence so suspended shall, during the time of suspension, be of no effect."

### A LAW TO AMEND THE ENGLISH SCHOOL (MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL) LAW, 1935.

BE it enacted :—

Short title.

35 of 1935.

Repeal of section 4 of Law 35 of 1935 and substitution of new section.

1. This Law may be cited as the English School (Management and Control) (Amendment) Law, 1936, and shall be read as one with the English School (Management and Control) Law, 1935, (hereinafter called "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the English School (Management and Control) Laws, 1935 and 1936.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :—

"Board of Management.

4.—(1) The English School, either in its present form or in such modified form as may be determined by the Governor under the provisions of section 3 (1) (a), shall be managed and controlled by a Board of Management which shall consist of—

(a) the Director of Education who shall be Chairman ;

(b) the Grantor ;

(c) a fit and proper person appointed by the Governor.

(2) The Governor may upon the death or resignation of the Grantor appoint a fit and proper person to fill the vacancy.

(3) The Governor may at any time terminate any appointment made by him under the provisions of this section.

(4) The Governor may upon the death, resignation, retirement or termination of appointment of any person appointed by him under the provisions of this section appoint another fit and proper person to fill the vacancy.

(5) The Governor may in the case of illness or absence from the Colony of any member of the Board of Management appoint a fit and proper person in the place of such member until such member shall resume his duties.

(6) The Board of Management shall conduct their meetings and proceedings and shall manage and control the English School in accordance with regulations made by them and approved by the Governor."

3. Sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following sub-section substituted therefor :—

"(2) Upon the closing of the English School as in sub-section (1) provided the Governor may, by writing under his hand, direct—

(a) that such part of the immovable and movable property mentioned in sections 2 and 3 as may remain undisposed of at the date of the closing be utilized for such purpose being for the benefit of the youth of the Colony as the Governor may determine, or be sold and the proceeds thereof be applied to such purpose aforesaid and in such manner as the Governor may determine ;

(b) that the proceeds of such part of the said immovable and movable property as may have been disposed of before the date of the closing be utilized in the like manner."

Repeal of sub-section (2) of section 5 of Law 35 of 1935 and substitution of new sub-section.
