A LAW TO AMEND THE INCREASE OF RENT (RESTRICTION)
LAWS, 1942 TO 1946.

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Increase of Rent (Restriction) (Amendment) Law, 1947, and shall be read as one with the Increase of Rent (Restriction) Laws, 1942 to 1946, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Increase of Rent (Restriction) Laws, 1942 to 1947.

2. Section 7 of the principal Law is hereby amended by the addition thereto after sub-section (3) of the following sub-sections :—

“(4) A President of a District Court or a District Judge, each sitting alone, shall have jurisdiction to deal with any claim or proceedings arising out of this section, notwithstanding that, by reason of the amount of the claim or otherwise, the case would not but for this provision be within the jurisdiction of a President of a District Court or a District Judge.

(5) In any claim or proceeding arising out of this section, the court fees and advocates' fees shall be regulated in accordance with any Rules of Court in force for the time being on the basis of the annual rent paid in respect of the premises at the time of the institution of the claim or proceeding.”

3. Section 10 of the principal Law is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) by the deletion of sub-section (5) thereof and the substitution therefor of the following sub-section :—

“(5) Every application or matter which the Board is empowered to hear or determine under the provisions of this Law shall be heard and determined by the President of the Board sitting with not less than two members of the Board as the President may direct.”;

(b) by the deletion therefrom of sub-section (6);

(c) by the re-numbering of sub-sections (7), (8), (9) and (10) as sub-sections (6), (7), (8) and (9), respectively.
