1. This Law may be cited as the Wine and Spirit (Warehouses) Law, 1924. Short title.

2. The High Commissioner may from time to time approve and appoint warehouses for the warehousing and securing of wines and spirits for exportation. All wines and spirits in such warehouses shall be stored in such manner as the Chief Collector of Customs shall direct. Power to appoint warehouses.

3. The High Commissioner may make, and from time to time revoke, alter or amend rules and regulations for the management of such warehouses and for the custody and withdrawal of wines and spirits and prescribe penalties for the breach thereof. Such rules and regulations shall be published in the *Cyprus Gazette*. Power to make regulations.

TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPORTATION OF TIMBER.

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulations (Amendment) Law, 1924, and shall be read as one with the Customs and Excise Regulations Law, 1879, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law) and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Customs and Excise Regulations Laws, 1879 and 1924, Short title.

2. The Principal Law, section 31, is hereby repealed and in place thereof the following section shall have effect:—

Timber,
charcoal and
firewood.

31.—(1) The exportation of all timber, charcoal and firewood, being the produce of Cyprus, is hereby prohibited provided always that the High Commissioner may authorise such exportation by licence under his hand.

(2) Any person exporting or attempting to export timber, charcoal and firewood save as provided by this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and all such articles exported or attempted to be exported shall be liable to forfeiture.

3. The Principal Law, section 32, is hereby repealed and in place thereof the following section shall have effect:—

Bark, tar,
pitch and
resin.

32.—(1) The exportation of all bark, tar, pitch or resin, being the produce of Cyprus, is hereby prohibited provided always that the High Commissioner may authorise such exportation by licence under his hand.

(2) Any person exporting or attempting to export bark, tar, pitch or resin save as provided by this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and all such articles exported or attempted to be exported shall be liable to forfeiture.
