TO AMEND THE LAW REGULATING PENSIONS, GRATUITIES AND OTHER ALLOWANCES TO BE GRANTED IN RESPECT OF OFFICES HELD IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE OF CYPRUS. A.D. 1927. 14 of 1927.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1927, and shall be read as one with the Pensions Law, 1905, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Law), and the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1924, and the Pensions (Amendment) Law, 1926, and the Pensions (Amendment, No. 2) Law, 1926, and the Principal Law and the said Laws and this Law may together be cited as the Pensions Laws, 1905 to 1927. Short title.

2. The Principal Law, section 6, is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "sixty years" in line 4 and the substitution therefor of the words "fifty-five years." Amendment of Law 2 of 1905, sec. 6.

3. The Principal Law, section 9, is hereby repealed and in place thereof the following section shall have effect :— Repeal of Law 2 of 1905, sec. 9 and substitution of new section.

9. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, with the approval of the Secretary of State, to require an officer to retire, or to permit an officer to retire, from the service of Cyprus at any time after he attains the age of fifty-five years, and retirement shall be compulsory for every officer on attaining the age of sixty years, provided that the Governor in Council may, subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, and with the consent of the officer, extend the period of the service of such officer.

• Provided always that an officer in the service of Cyprus at the time of the coming into operation of this Law shall not be liable to compulsory retirement under this section before he attains the age of sixty years.

4. The Principal Law, Third Schedule, is hereby repealed and in place thereof the following Schedule shall be substituted :— Repeal of Law 2 of 1905, Third Schedule, and substitution of new Schedule.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

(Clause 19 of the Regulations.)

The number of years to be added to the period of service under Clause 19 of the Regulations for the purpose of computing pensions is as follows:—

For the First Class	Ten years.
For the Second Class	Seven years.
For the Third Class	Five years.

The First Class comprises :

Judges of the Supreme Court.

The Second Class comprises :

Attorney-General.

The Third Class comprises :

Presidents of the District Courts.

Ordinary Judges of the District Courts.

Solicitor-General.

BE it therefore enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation Law, 1927.

Appropriation of £42,832 for twelve months ended 31st December, 1926.

2. There shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ended the thirty-first day of December, 1926, an additional sum not exceeding the sum of forty-two thousand eight hundred and thirty-two pounds for defraying the charges of the Government of Cyprus for such period. The said amount shall be appropriated as follows:—
