BE it enacted :—

Short title,

1. This Law may be cited as the Burials (Amendment) Law, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Burials Law, 1896, (hereinafter called “ the Principal Law ”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Burials Laws, 1896 and 1937.

2. Section 8 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the deletion of the words “ a fee of 3c.p.” and the substitution therefor of the words “ a fee of four and a half piastres ”.

A LAW TO AMEND THE VILLAGE AUTHORITIES LAWS,

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Village Authorities (Amendment) Law, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Village Authorities Laws, 1931 to (No. 2) 1935, (hereinafter called “ the Principal Law ”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Village Authorities Laws, 1931 to 1937.

Repeal of
section 15 of
the Principal
Law and
substitution
of new

2. Section 15 of the Principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :—

“ Fees to
Mukhtars
and Azas,
and penalty.

15.—(1) The Mukhtars appointed under this Law shall be entitled to receive the fees specified in Part I of the First Schedule, in respect of the several matters therein mentioned.

(2) The Azas appointed under this Law shall be entitled to receive the fee specified in Part II of the First Schedule, in respect of the matter therein mentioned.

(3) No Mukhtar or Aza shall be entitled to demand or receive any fee that is not prescribed by this or any other Law.

- (4) Any Mukhtar or Aza who—
 (a) acts in contravention of sub-section (3);
 or
 (b) knowingly furnishes a false certificate,
 shall be guilty of an offence and shall on
 conviction be liable for each such offence
 to a fine not exceeding ten pounds, without
 prejudice to any other penalty which he may
 have incurred.”

3. The First Schedule to the Principal Law is hereby amended as follows:—

- (i) By the deletion of the heading “ FEES ” and by
the substitution therefor of the following headings:—

“ PART I.

FEES TO MUKHTARS.”

- (ii) By the repeal of paragraph III thereof and by the
substitution therefor of the following paragraph:—

“ III. For every certificate given under the
provisions of the Cattle Certificate Law, 1889:— 9 of 1889.

- (a) For each certificate for each bull, calf,
camel, cow, donkey, gelding, heifer, horse,
mare, mule, ox or steer 4½p.
(b) For each certificate for each ewe, goat,
hog, kid, lamb, pig, sheep or sow .. 1p.
(c) For each certificate after the first ten
certificates given at the same trans-
action in respect of any of the animals
mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof .. 2p.
(d) For each certificate after the first ten
certificates given at the same transaction
in respect of any of the animals
mentioned in paragraph (b) hereof .. 0½p.”

- (iii) By the insertion of the following paragraph after
paragraph VI thereof:—

“ VII. For every certificate on the back of every
duplicate unmounted photograph accompanying
an application for a passport and required to
be certified under instructions issued by the
Governor 6p.”

(iv) By the insertion of the following Part as Part II at the end thereof :—

“ PART II.

FEE TO AZAS.

For every certificate on the back of every duplicate unmounted photograph accompanying an application for a passport and required to be certified under instructions issued by the Governor . . . 3p.”

A LAW TO AMEND THE RURAL CONSTABLES LAWS,
1932 AND 1934.

BE it enacted :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Rural Constables (Amendment) Law, 1937, and shall be read as one with the Rural Constables Laws, 1932 and 1934, (hereinafter called “ the Principal Law ”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Rural Constables Laws, 1932 to 1937.

2. Sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion of the words “, together with a fee for the Mukhtar calculated at the rate of two and a half per centum on the amount so required (but not exceeding a total fee of five pounds in any one year),” after the words “ for the ensuing year ”.

3. Sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion of the following Proviso at the end thereof :—

“ Provided that any amount representing the fee of the Mukhtar in section 8 (1) prescribed shall, when paid to the Mukhtar, be retained by him.”
