

Penalties for breaches of regulations or bye-laws.

6. The regulations or bye-laws made under this Law may provide for the imposition on offenders against the same of penalties not exceeding five pounds for each offence, and in case of a continuing offence a further penalty not exceeding two pounds for each day during which the offence continues :

Provided that all penalties recovered under any bye-laws made under this Law for offences committed within the limits of a municipal corporation shall be paid to the fund of the municipal corporation concerned.

7. The Hotels and Public Buildings Regulation Law, 1928, is hereby repealed :

Provided that all Orders, regulations and bye-laws made thereunder and subsisting on the date of the commencement of this Law shall, in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Law, remain in force until revoked or replaced by Orders, regulations or bye-laws made under the provisions of this Law.

A LAW TO EMPOWER THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL TO ALTER THE IMPORT DUTIES OF CUSTOMS LEVIABLE ON WHEAT AND FLOUR.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Wheat and Flour (Import Duties of Customs Variation) Law, 1938.

Interpretation.

2. In this Law—

“ flour ” means flour of wheat, rye or maize and includes crushed wheat and semolina.

Power of Governor in Council to increase or reduce duties of Customs on wheat and flour.

3.—(1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other Law contained the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order increase or reduce the import duties of Customs leviable and recoverable on wheat or flour imported into the Colony under the provisions of any Law.

(2) Whenever an Order has been made under the provisions of this section, the import duties of Customs on wheat or flour, as increased or reduced thereby shall, for so long as such Order remains in force, be leviable and recoverable in accordance with the provisions of the Law for the time being in force relating to the levying and collecting of such duties.

4. The Flour (Duties of Customs Variation) Law, 1935, is hereby repealed.

A LAW TO PROVIDE FOR A SUMMER AFTERNOON
RECESS IN PLACES OF BUSINESS.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Summer Afternoon Recess Law, 1938.

Short title.

2. In this Law—

“place of business” includes any place or premises in or upon which any trade, industry or business is carried on.

Interpreta-
tion.

3.—(1) The Governor may by Order in Council to be published in the *Gazette* (hereinafter called “a closing order”) direct that places of business shall be closed and kept closed—

orders.

(a) during such period between the first day of June and the thirtieth day of September in any year ; and

(b) on such days of the week ; and

(c) for such interval between the hours of twelve o'clock noon and three o'clock in the afternoon (hereinafter called “the afternoon recess”),

as may be specified in the Order :

Provided that the Governor in Council may exempt from the operation of any such Order any place of business specified therein.
