**THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS**

**No. 34 of 1944.**

A LAW TO APPROPRIATE A SUM NOT EXCEEDING TWO MILLION, FIVE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND AND TWENTY-NINE POUNDS TO THE SERVICE OF THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDING THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF DECEMBER, IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FORTY-FOUR.

**W**HEREAS it is necessary to make provision for such expenses of the Government of Cyprus for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1944, as are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law. Preamble.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation Law, Short title. 1944.

Appropriation of  
£2,533,029.

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated to the service of the King or which may be hereafter lawfully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1944, out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony, any sum not exceeding the sum of Two Million, Five Hundred and Thirty-Three Thousand and Twenty-Nine Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for such period.

3. A sum not exceeding the amount set down under each head in the Schedule hereto may be issued and spent in respect of the Establishment or Service specified and referred to therein.

4. This Law shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1944.
