**A LAW TO AMEND THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY
LAWS, 1939 TO 1943.**

Officer Administering the Government.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Amendment) Law, 1945, and shall be read as one with the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1943, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945.

2. Section 12A of the principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after sub-section (3) of the following sub-section :—

“(4) The foregoing provisions of this section shall, as respects any area which, at the date of the coming into force of section 12B of this Law, is an area under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is then at war, not have effect as respects anything done or omitted to be done on or after that date.”

3. The principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion after section 12A of the following section :—

“Special
provisions
as to areas
under enemy
sovereignty.

12B. As respects anything done or omitted to be done on or after the date of the coming into force of this section, any area which on the said date is under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is then at war shall be treated for all the purposes of this Law (including the purposes of any order made thereunder) as enemy territory :

Provided that, in the case of an area which, apart from this section would not be treated as enemy territory, the Governor may by order direct that for all the said purposes or such of the said purposes as may be specified in the order the area shall, as from such day as may be so specified, be treated as not being enemy territory and different days may be specified by such orders as aforesaid in relation to different purposes.”
