WHEREAS the Appropriation Law, 1944, made certain provision for defraying the charges of the Government of Cyprus for the twelve months ended on the thirty-first day of December, 1944, and whereas it is necessary to make certain additional provision for the public service for the said period.

BE it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—
