A LAW TO AMEND THE INCREASE OF RENT
(RESTRICTION) LAWS, 1942 TO 1947.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Increase of Rent (Restriction) (Amendment) Law, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Increase of Rent (Restriction) Laws, 1942 to 1947 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Increase of Rent (Restriction) Laws, 1942 to 1949.

2. Section 7 of the principal Law is hereby further amended as follows:—

(a) by the substitution in paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of a semicolon for the colon (line 11) and the insertion immediately thereafter of the word “ or ” ;

(b) by the insertion in sub-section (1) immediately after paragraph (c) of the following paragraph:—

“(d) on the ground that the premises, being a dwelling house or part of a dwelling house as defined in sub-section (6) of section 5 of this Law, and having been let to the tenant in consequence of his employment by the landlord, are, upon such employment having come to an end, reasonably required by the landlord for occupation as a residence for some person engaged in his whole time employment:”

(c) by the substitution in sub-section (2) of the words “,(c) and (d)” for the words “and (c)” (line 3).

(d) by the insertion therein immediately after sub-section (3) of the following sub-section:—

“(3A) Proceedings for the recovery of possession of any premises under paragraph (d) of sub-section (1) of this section may be taken by the landlord under the provisions of the Recovery of Possession of Small Holdings Law, 1895, notwithstanding that by reason of the term of the tenant or the amount of the annual rent such proceedings could not, but for this sub-section, be taken under the provisions of the aforesaid Law.”
